- Creates the budget and funds the government




Executive






What is the Farm Bill?

- A collection of laws that govern most of the agriculture and food programs in the US.
- The bill:
 - Creates mandatory spending and programs
 - Authorizes discretionary spending and programs
- Authorized every 5 or so years.
 - The omnibus nature of the bill brings together many groups that wouldn't otherwise collaborate, and stirs fierce competition among others over spending priorities.



2014 Farm Bill Dollars




\$956 billion over 10 years (2014-23)

Appropriations

- The annual budgeting and funding cycle
 - The Budget How much money Congress can spend each year
 - Appropriations How
 Congress decides what to
 spend money on
- Conservation Programs actually lose funding in this process
